ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF REGINA'S SITE



INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES: CREE OR SAULTEAUX

BACHELOR OF ARTS

FNUniv's Department of Indigenous Languages, Arts and Cultures works to strengthen the First Nations identity by ensuring the survival of Saskatchewan First Nations languages. The department offers majors in Cree, Saulteaux and minors in Cree, Dakota, Dene, Nakota, and Saulteaux.

INDIGENOUS STUDIES

BACHELOR OF ARTS

The program is open to both Indigenous and Non-indigenous students and explores the history and life of Indigenous people in Saskatchewan, Canada, North America and around the world. It incorporates traditional teachings offered by Elders, as well as traditional perspectives and content. Courses specifically foster critical thinking skills, written and oral expression, and the development of research methods.

INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGES (CHINESE, GERMAN, JAPANESE, SPANISH)

BACHELOR OF ARTS

Open the gateway to languages and cultures. Broaden your perspective on values and cultural traditions that are Influential across the globe with courses focusing on language, religious beliefs, and cultural awareness.

BACHELOR OF ARTS

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION Learn accounting theories and practices in an applicable way. Gain experience with managerial, financial, and cost accounting practices, and learn how to prepare and analyze financial statements.

EDUCATION - SASKATCHEWAN URBAN TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM (SUNTEP)

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION

Incorporates native studies and crosscultural education with a solid foundation in the mechanics of teaching while spending a substantial amount of time working with teachers and their students in mostly urban schools.

EDUCATION - SECONDARY

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION

You will be required to identify a major and minor area of focus. Majors: Biology, Chemistry, English, General Science, Health, Mathematics, Physical Education, Physics, and Social Studies. Minors: Arts Education, Dance, Drama, French, General Science, and Outdoor Education.

ENGINEERING - ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS

BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE

Focuses on analog and digital electronics with specialization streams in instrumentation and control, telecommunications, microelectronics, and power and energy. Software and computer-related courses are part of the program, allowing students to develop greater software and hardware abilities.

ENGINEERING - ENVIRONMENTAL SYSTEMS

BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE

Plan, design, and evaluate solutions to environmental problems in the areas of water resource systems, regional infrastructure systems, waste management, and air pollution.

ENGINEERING - INDUSTRIAL SYSTEMS

BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE

Designed to develop engineers who can organize and effectively utilize the total resources of modern manufacturing and process industries. This includes the materials, machinery, facilities, people, and capital.

ENGINEERING - PETROLEUM SYSTEMS

BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE

Evaluates, designs, and manages technologies in evaluating reserves, surface collection, and treatment facilities for oil and gas. Advanced computer utilization and automation combined with effective communications skills are integrated within the program. Techniques developed for the recovery of petroleum can be applied to the extraction of other important minerals.


