Direct-Entry Pathways

Students in Canada do not begin studies related to many popular professions, including medicine, law and dentistry, directly from high school. These programs require several years of undergraduate coursework before students are eligible

While completion of a UWinnipeg pre-professional program does not guarantee admission into a professional faculty, you will benefit from our small class sizes, personalized instruction and state-of-the-art science facilities.

Students must be aware of restrictions international students may face with admissions to professional programs, and should do their own research on professional schools (which ones accept international students and their entrance requirements), prior to applying or beginning any of these programs. Many of our pre-professional studies lead to a bachelor's degree, which will offer flexibility and options for graduates.

If you are interested in subjects that are not part of your major subject area, know that you can take courses from outside your major - and doing so will allow you to complete requirements for your degree!

For example, science majors can take courses in statistics, economics or humanities. Humanities majors can take courses in biology or environmental sciences. There are many possibilities!

Double majors and minors give students many options to add scope to a degree program, and our academic advisors can help you plan the courses that are right for you.

- > (International) General Certificate of Education. with two subjects at Advanced Level and three at Ordinary Level, or three subjects at Advanced Level and one at the Ordinary Level
- > Secondary School Grade: C (with no mark below a D) or 4 (no grade below a 3). Grade 11/AS-level students may be considered for the UWinnipeg Pre-University Pathway Program (see p.13)

American

- > Complete grade 12 with a minimum high school average of C+ or better on a minimum of 5 academic subjects
- > No SAT required

International Baccalaureate

- > Diploma students: automatic scholarship of \$2,250 for 30+ points, including the extended essay and Theory of
- > Recognition for non-diploma students: \$250 for each IB final result of 7 (HL), \$200 for each IB final result of 6 (HL) or 7 (SL), \$150 for each IB final result of 5 (HL)
- > English waiver for achieving 4 or higher on English A
- > Transfer credit awarded for more than 20 courses, resulting in fewer courses to take at university and the opportunity to start at an advanced level

Advanced Placement

- > National AP Scholars: automatic scholarship of \$2,250 for writing five AP final examinations and obtaining an average of at least 4.0
- > English waiver for achieving 3+ on AP English examination (Language Composition; Literature and Composition)
- > Recognition for individual courses: \$250 for each AP exam result of 5, \$150 for each AP exam result of 3
- > Transfer credit awarded for more than 25 courses, resulting in fewer courses to take at university and the opportunity to start at an advanced level

Apply Online

Start by creating an account with your personal email and password. Once you log in, you can add an undergraduate program, then select the faculty and major.

You will receive a confirmation email that your application was submitted, which includes a student number to use in all communication with the Admissions Office.

Pay the Application Fee

Pay the \$120 application fee through Paypal or Flywire by a variety of methods, including bank transfer or credit card.

04.

Submit all Required Documents

After you submit the application, you will receive an email requesting your official documents, which may include official copies of transcripts*, proof of English language level, and proof of citizenship. Documents that are not in English will require an official translation.

The Manitoba Advantage

Students who have completed an undergraduate degree at UWinnipeg are eligible for a post-graduation work permit, which offers the opportunity to work in Canada after graduation.

Immigrate to Manitoba

The Manitoba Provincial Nominee Program is a priority assessment stream for international students with strong ties to Manitoba, who are interested in immigrating. It offers the opportunity for international student graduates to apply for permanent residence status in Canada. Manitoba nominated 1,923 international graduates for permanent residency in 2018.

Scholarships and Awards

There are many ways to fund your education as an international student. In addition to entrance awards, international students are also eligible for in-course awards after the first year.

Scholarship Opportunities

President's Scholarship for World Leaders

This scholarship will be given to international students (including U.S. students) entering any of UWinnipeg's divisions for the first time. Candidates must be involved in activities that demonstrate leadership, have a minimum 80% admission average or equivalent, and entering the first year of any program.

Scholarships will be awarded to two students from each of the following regions:

- > The Americas & Caribbean
- Africa & Europe
- > Asia & Middle East

Value: \$5,000

Special Entrance Scholarships

Available to international students studying in Canada, students studying Canadian curriculum overseas, and students from the U.S. Must have a final grade 12 admission average of 85% or higher, and have completed an application for admission before March 1.

Value: \$1,100-\$2,250

After the First Year

There are hundreds of awards available for all types of students after the first full year of study.

International Baccalaureate Entrance Scholarship

Students must present the International Baccalaureate Diploma with a grade total of at least 30, including the extended essay and the Theory of Knowledge course, and with no grade below 4 on the 3 higher level and 3 standard level papers.

Value: \$2,250

Advanced Placement Program Entrance Scholarship

Awarded to students who are entering UWinnipeg as a National AP Scholar. Students must write five AP final examinations and obtain an average of at least 4.0 on these examinations.

Value: \$2 250

AP/IB Transfer Credit Scholarships

International Student Guide

Students who are admitted directly from high school and choose to transfer AP or IB exam results as credit towards their undergraduate studies will receive a scholarship.

Values:

- > \$250 for each AP exam result of 5
- > \$150 for each AP exam result of 4
- > \$250 for each IB final result of 7 on higher level papers
- > \$200 for each IB final result of 6 on higher level papers and 7 on standard level papers
- > \$150 for each IB final result of 5 on higher level papers
