ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High School Students

The minimum requirement for admission is graduation from a BC high school with English 12 (or equivalent) plus an additional three Grade 12 academic courses from TWU's approved course list. Four academic Grade 11 courses are also required, not including physical and health education, career education, applied design, skills and technology courses. The Literacy and Numeracy Assessment will be required to confirm your admission to TWU. If you are from other Canadian provinces or the US, please check **twu.ca/admissions-aid**. All students must meet TWU's English proficiency standard.

Approved Academic Courses

Homeschool Students

If you're enrolled with a blended learning school and set to graduate with a provincial high

school diploma, regular provincial admissions requirements would pertain to you. If you do not fulfil those requirements, you may complete the regular admission application and submit a Home Schooled Education Background chart. (Admissions counsellors will provide the document.) Visit **twu.ca/homeschool** or contact your Admissions Counsellor for more details.

International Students

The admission requirements for international students applying to TWU include:

- Official School Documentation
- Certification for English Language Proficiency (There are eight ways that you can meet this requirement. Visit **twu.ca/admissions-aid/undergraduate/international-applicants**)

HOW TO APPLY

Trinity Western accepts applications year round. To meet the priority application deadline, complete both your admissions and financial aid applications by **March 1**.

1. Apply for admission online at **twu.ca/apply**
2. Send the most recent updated copy of your grades
3. Apply for financial aid at **twu.ca/awards**

As soon as we receive your transcripts, we'll evaluate your application. Your admissions counsellor will contact you once a decision has been made. (Note: You can email us a clear, easy-to-read scan or photo of your interim grades. Your official, final transcript must be mailed from your school in a sealed envelope.)
